During the afternoon, we heard from a survivor of the Holocaust who came to England to escape the Nazis. It was very moving to hear all of the horrible things he had to deal with when he was only a child. Year 5 gained a lot from the trip and spent some time considering how important it is to treat others with respect, no matter what their background is.
