Core Behaviours Launch Day

On Monday 4th September children across the school participated in a range of learning activities to further develop their understanding of two of our Core Behaviours: Resilience and Altruism.

'I use resilience on a daily basis during lessons when I find something difficult and I'm determined to solve it.' – Hana Y6

'I like the way we learn how to be resilient at a very young age, so as we get older it becomes natural to us.' – Sabreena Y6

'We demonstrate resilience on a day-to-day basis as we face new challenges every day and learn from our mistakes.' – Krish Y6

Our Learning

During this half term our learning is linked to the theme 'Slavery'. The children will be focusing on different periods in history to look at the impact of slavery and how it still has an impact upon our world today. They will be taking opportunities to link their learning to all subject areas, using their skills in geography to map the journeys taken throughout history, as well as making links within design and technology to understand the impact a product can have on people and the environment.

Additionally, in science, the children across the school have been exploring the topic 'Animals including Humans' and developing their own enquiry questions linked to this.

It has been fantastic to hear the children sharing their holiday projects with their peers and teachers. We have been truly amazed by the effort each pupil has put into this and the depth of their learning and understanding.

Nursery

Our children have come back to Nursery beautifully this week, showing such fantastic enthusiasm for their learning. We have also welcomed new children into our class. We have started the year by getting to know each other, exploring how we are the same and how we are different through discussions about ourselves and our families and through a selection of books. The children have enjoyed creating representations of themselves and their families. We are going to continue this exploration by creating selfportraits in the coming weeks!



Reception

The children have been thinking about their families, and their own interests. They have produced some lovely art work and have had super discussions based around their personal objects brought in, as part of their summer holiday homework challenge.

<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 are learning about animals and the different groups they belong to. We have been exploring why different animals belong to these groups by looking at their features. During the half term we will also be using our historical skills to investigate the question: Would Wangari Maathai have been significant if the transatlantic slave had still exisited?

<u>Year 2</u>

In Year 2 we have been exploring what life was like during Victorian times, particularly focusing on the question: What can we learn about slavery from the Victorian period?





Year 3

In Year 3 we are exploring the question: How did slavery shape Egyptian civilisation? We have also been utilising our science skills to investigate different skeletons and which animals they belong to.

Year 4

In Year 4 we are exploring the question: Did the Romans bring slavery to Britain and what impact did it have on society?

We have been looking at our teeth and comparing them to skulls of animals – predicting the food they eat using their teeth to tell us. Following this, we set up an experiment to test the effect different liquids have on the teeth using eggshells to represent the enamel of our teeth.

Year 5

Year 5 are learning about the Vikings and exploring the question: Why did the Vikings invade Britain? The children have become archaeologists digging for artefacts and used their skills to determine what the artefacts were and how the Vikings used them in daily life.



Year 6

In Year 6 we are investigating the question: What role did Victorian Britain play in the transatlantic slave trade? We have also been conducting research related to our topic 'Animals including Humans', in which we have focused on the circulatory system. We shared our learning using a range of mediums, including podcasts, news reports and quizzes.
