# **Design & Technology**



Across school, we have been exploring textiles as part of our Design Technology learning this term. The children were tasked with designing a tabard for a health worker to wear. They had to ensure it was hygienic and appealing to the user. Each class designed their product and then practised the sewing skills needed as part of the process.



Early years learnt how to weave over and under. The children also used lacing boards to develop the skill of threading.

Year one learnt how to thread a needle and to complete a running stitch with large holed binka fabric.






Year two independently sewed onto a piece of fabric to develop their stitching skills and learnt how to cross stitch.

### **Design & Technology**



Year Three used fabric paints and buttons to design their own badge for the apron. They sewed this onto the prototype using their own choice of stitch.


Year Four further refined their stitches, learnt a blanket stitch and made a pocket to fit on the apron.



Year Six had a detailed design process. They used market research to look at products already being used. They thought about how the product would need to be mass- produced and how they could achieve this. They applied their previous knowledge on materials and stitches to choose the most suitable for the product.



Year Five carefully thought about the user in the design process and learnt how to sew items together leaving a seam. They enjoyed deconstructing clothing and aprons to explore how they were joined together.
