# **Year 3 Autumn Newsletter 2022**

Welcome to the Autumn term at Edna G. Olds Academy. The children have made a wonderful start to Year 3 and I look forward to teaching your children for the rest of the academic year.

## **English**

This term, we will focus on becoming confident on using literacy techniques, such as adverbial phrases, fronted adverbials and prepositions. We will be using a range of outdoor learning, drama and lpads to support our creativity and writing of a diary entry and newspaper report. Our class author this half term is Shirely Climo who wrote 'Egyptian Cinderella'. Our class novel is called 'Planet Omar: Accidental Trouble Magnet' by Zanib Mian. This book was chosen by all of the children in Year 3.

### Maths

In maths, Year 3 will be representing, comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000. They will be applying their understanding of place value, addition and subtraction to answer word and reasoning problems. In year 3, your child is expected to learn their 3, 4 and 8 timestable. Therefore, It is crucial that they are encouraged and supported at home to practise their times tables. All children have access to TTRS and Mathletics to support with this.

# **Topic**

This Autumn term our enquiry based curriculum will focus on resilience. In science, we will be learning about forces and magnets. We will be using exploration around the school to aid understanding of this. Your child will be able to observe how forces are used in everyday life, measure force using a force meter and record data in a table, and test objects to see if they are magnetic.

Our history enquiry this term is 'How did late neolithic hunter gatherers survive in such a hostile environment without the technology we enjoy today?' To be able to answer this enquiry, Year 3 will learn all about the life after the Ice Age and the introduction of farming into Britain, using a range of historical sources.
