Reception

In reception we have been settling into our new classroom and exploring the different learning areas. We have had lots fun exploring in our outside area, finding minibeasts and drawing pictures. Olaoluwa found out, through observation, that ladybirds have 6 legs and they can fly!







Year 1

Our overarching history enquiry question this half term is 'Would Wangari Maathai have been significant if the transatlantic slave trade still existed?'. In order to delve in to this question, we learnt all about a little girl named Wangari, she noticed something very sad 70 years ago — the beautiful trees around her village were being cut down. This made Wangari feel very upset, but also very determined. She decided she wanted to do something magical; Wangari grew up and started planting thousands of trees, and she even created something called the "Green Belt Movement". Wangari believed that every tree planted could make the world a better place and so, we took part in our own planting activities, we had lots of fabulous fun!





Year 2

In year 2 we have been exploring the inspirational life of Harriet Tubman. We discovered some of the signs used to support passengers of the Underground Railroad. We painted each other's left foot to print our own tree trunk sign. These footprints helped the passengers to the safety of the free state.



Year 3

As part of our learning about resilience, Year 3 read the book 'Beautiful Oops'. They investigated whether they could turn a 'mistake' (a splash of paint across their page) into something they liked by using their imaginations. We had some wonderful creative artwork, as a result.

Year 4

In year 4 we have been investigating which countries were conquered by the Roman Empire during their reign. The first Roman King, Romulus, took us on a tour back in time to learn about the Roman times. The multi-media we used helped bring out learning to life.



Year 5

Year 5 have been learning about the Vikings. Pupils have been sampling what it is like to be an archaeologist, by unearthing Viking artefacts and studying them closely to see what they tell us about Viking life. This helps us to understand and compare how our life varies today from Roman times.







Year 6

Year 6 have been exploring the circulatory system and studying the effects of exercise on the body. We participated in outdoor activities to measure and record our heart rates (BPM). We also created our own circulatory system sculptures and identified the main functions of the heart, blood, and blood vessels.

Live Assembly

We are proud to have taken part in the live (nationwide) assembly this morning, alongside 100's of other UK schools.

On Friday 6th September, all children in KS2 took part in a live school assembly 'Celebrating our Differences and Overcoming Adversity'. Thousands of children across the country were able to join the assembly where there was time to reflect on the events that took place over the summer, explore the British Values of 'Mutual Respect' and 'Tolerance', and provide an opportunity to celebrate who we are and the importance of strengths in our local communities.
