Year 1 Autumn Newsletter 2024

Welcome to the Autumn term at Edna G. Olds Academy. The children have made a wonderful start to Year 1 and I look forward to teaching your children for the rest of the academic year.

English

This term, we will focus on becoming confident in always using capital letters and punctuation, and creating a series of sentences that are enhanced with adjectives. Our class book this half term is 'Wanda and the Alien' by Sue Hendra. We will be using a range of outdoor learning and drama to support our creativity and writing of a narrative and information text linked to this text.

Our class novel is 'Paddington' by Michael Bond, and this book was chosen by all of the children in Year 1.

Maths

In Maths, Year 1 will be representing, comparing and ordering numbers up to 10. They will then be applying their understanding of place value to learn about addition and subtraction. In year 1, your child is expected to learn their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Therefore, it is crucial that they are encouraged and supported at home to practise their times tables. All children have access to Numbots to support with this.

Topic

This Autumn term our enquiry based curriculum will focus on slavery. Our history enquiry this term is 'Would Wangari Maathai have been significant if the transatlantic slave trade still existed?' To be able to answer this enquiry, Year 1 will learn about slavery and its impact. We will be uncovering who Wangari Maathai is and why she is an important person.



In science, we will be learning about animals, including humans. We will identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, and sort them into the different categories: carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
