


### **Attendance**

# **Visit from the High Sheriff**

We were delighted to invite the High Sheriff to Edna G. Olds Academy on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> November. The High Sheriff of Nottingham conducted an assembly for the children. He came dressed in his formal clothing, which he would wear to important meetings. The High Sheriff explained his role and how he makes a difference to the people of Nottingham. He was very passionate about helping children; he gave examples of how he supports children through sports and his charities. Another passion of his is to support communities in poverty, which his charity also supports. The children of Edna G. Olds were also given an opportunity to ask the High Sheriff questions about his role, why he wanted to become the High Sheriff and also what his favourite part of the role is.

# **Cinema Trips**

#### **Cricket Tournament**

Year 1 had a brilliant trip to Harvey Hadden Sports Village where we took part in a KS1 cricket festival. There was a carousel of activities that developed cricket skills, for example, bowling a ball and aiming at the wicket, batting a ball from a cone, catching a ball with both our hands, and feet. The children worked brilliantly together showcasing our school values.



#### **Planetarium**

Year 5 and 6 have been incredibly fortunate to have had the astronomy team from Nottingham University visit our classrooms, over the last 4 weeks. They have learned about the planets in our Solar System, how to classify different galaxies and how to recognise constellations and use the North Star to navigate. The children asked some brilliant questions, and our visitors were particularly impressed with the enthusiasm that the children demonstrated. The children's favourite moment was the inflatable Planetarium, which was too large to fit in a picture! The children went inside to see projected images of the constellations and learned about some of the myths surrounding them.







## **Criminal Justice System**

Year 5 had a visit from our local PCSO who works with Nottingham Police Department. The children learnt about the Criminal Justice System and the people who are involved from the moment a crime has been committed, all the way to sentencing. The children found this fascinating and have been inspired by the different job roles within the justice system. We are very much looking forward to our next visit in the New Year!
