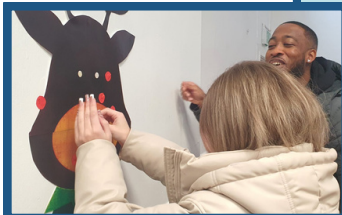
Christmas Fair

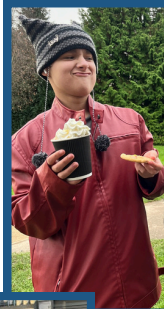
Gingerbread Houses

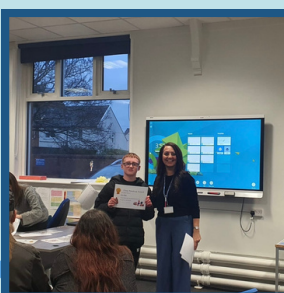
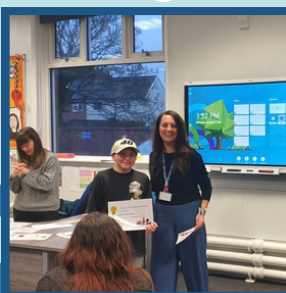
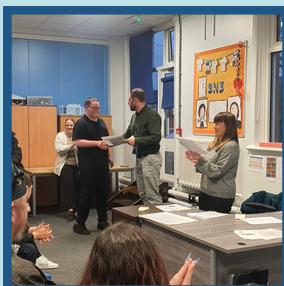
