We are delighted to welcome everyone back after the summer holidays! We hope you enjoyed a well-deserved break, full of fun, relaxation, and special memories with family and friends. A new school year is always an exciting time, we are very much looking forward to the year ahead and noting the achievements of all the children.

#### **Core Values Launch Day**

Our school ethos is underpinned by our twelve core values. They are split into the personal and the social values we feel are essential in developing our pupils into the leaders of the future. At the start of each half term the children focus on two of these, to further embed and develop their understanding of what they mean and how they can demonstrate these.

On Tuesday 2nd September children across the school participated in a range of learning activities to further develop their understanding of two of our Core Values: Resilience and Altruism.

#### **Core Values Launch**



#### **Nursery**

In Nursery we talked about the word 'resilience' and what this means. We discussed trying our best, and keeping on going even when we find things hard. We played a game of musical chairs to practice our resilience skills, and really tried our best to support our friends even when we didn't win!

#### Reception

Reception children read the book 'Giraffe's Can't Dance' which illustrates resilience through Gerald the giraffe. Despite being laughed at because he 'can't dance' like the other animals, Gerald doesn't give up and learns to dance in his own unique way. This inspired the children to make their own music to dance to using different musical instruments!



#### Year 1

Year 1 learnt that resilience means not giving up even when things may get difficult! As part of our learning about resilience, we got into groups and we formed a human knot with our hands and arms. We had to work as a team to untie ourselves from this difficult task. After we completed the task and didn't give up when it as hard, we felt very proud of ourselves!







As part of our core values day Year 2 had to line themselves up tallest to smallest without speaking to each other. The children started off in small groups and the groups gradually got bigger. The children demonstrated excellent teamwork and did not give up, showing their resilience.



#### Year 3

In Year 3 the children explored two key core values: **altruism** and **resilience**. In the morning, they learned about altruism through stories, role-play, and a secret helper challenge. They also created helping hands to share their own ideas and wrote or illustrated stories about selfless acts. In the afternoon, the focus shifted to resilience. The children discussed strategies for persevering through challenges, developed their own resilience toolkits and engaged in practical team-based activities; which included untangling themselves out of a human knot and silently arranging themselves by height and shoe size. These tasks encouraged collaboration, problem-solving, and determination. By the end of the day, the children had developed a strong understanding of how both values contribute to a positive and supportive school community.





#### Year 4

In Year 4, we focused on the core values: resilience and altruism. During part of our day, we used drama and role play to think about how we could be more altruistic. Our role plays gave us an opportunity to think about how we can help people at school, home and in the wider community. Our drama scenarios also allowed for us to show resilience too, as many of our scenarios showed that with a little bit of help, we can keep trying. This linked back to our learning pits that we created earlier in the day.



#### Year 5

In year 5, we built on our understanding of altruism and how many things can influence acts of altruism. We listened to a story call 'Those Shoes' which explored the difference between 'want' and 'need'. We considered the question, "Is it harder to be altruistic when you also want something?' We used "hot seating" to consider how each character in the story felt and reflected on situations where we found it difficult to be altruistic in contrast to those times when it is easier.

When learning about our core value, resilience, We read the book 'Your Fantastic, Elastic Brain.' Then used string to demonstrate how when we learn, our brain makes connections which grow stronger. We learnt about the importance of having a growth mindset and how this can improve our learning before creating a piece of artwork that demonstrated our understanding.





#### Year 6

To launch our core values learning, we discussed the importance of having a growth mindset and how Year 6 pupils can develop one. We explored strategies to shift our thinking from a fixed mindset to a growth mindset, and we also learnt about how the brain works, including the role of neurons.

As part of our learning, we created artwork that represented resilience. We also held a class debate to explore the concept of altruism, discussing its importance both in school and in the wider community. During the debate, we considered the thought-provoking question: "Can true altruism really exist, or is there always something in it for us?"





#### **Our Learning**

During this half term our learning is linked to the theme 'Slavery'. The children will be focusing on different periods in history to look at the impact of slavery and how it still has an impact upon our world today. They will be taking opportunities to link their learning to all subject areas, using their skills in geography to map the journeys taken throughout history, as well as making links within design and technology to understand the impact a product can have on people and the environment.
