Remembrance Day

On Tuesday 11th November we held a special Remembrance Assembly in order to honour our war veterans. Poppy wreaths were laid by each class and a 2 minute's silence was held. The children have been reflecting upon the sacrifices made during war and conflict, as well as thinking about how veterans' past sacrifices have enabled us to treasure the values and freedoms we experience today.



Teaching and Learning

Anti-Bullying Week

This week is anti-bullying week. The focus this year has been 'Make a noise about bullying'. The children loved wearing odd socks to school on Monday 10th November to celebrate their individuality and why that is important. Children across the school were involved in a number of learning activities to support their understanding of the different types of bullying, their rights to be happy and safe and their responsibilities towards bullying. The children also linked their learning to our core values, thinking about how they should be courageous to stand up for what they know is right. We discussed not being a bystander if they see or hear something they know is wrong.





AR Technology

This week, children across school were immersed in their learning through the use of virtual reality headsets on loan from LEAD. Year 2 looked at a variety of animals and sea creatures such as dolphins, and even 'walked' with a pride of beautiful Lions. Year 6 explored the circulatory system in 3D and Year 5 explored rocks, soils and the Earth's layers, inspired by the work of William Smith.









The History of Edna G. Olds Academy

On Thursday 6th November, some of our Year 6 children were lucky enough to have the opportunity to interview two ladies that attended Edna G. Olds Academy in 1969 when it first opened. The children asked lots of wonderful questions to find out more about the history of their school.

The layout of our classrooms is still the same, but lots of other things have changed. They told us that mathematics, art, English and drama were the main subjects taught around the school. We realised that we still have quite a lot in common with them. For example, we still swim at the Lenton Centre and have sports day at the local park. They told us that pupils used to work really hard to earn a special pen for neat handwriting, whereas we are all lucky enough to be given a pen in Year 3. It was amazing to hear how much Edna G. Olds Academy has changed over time, but also lovely to see that some of our traditions have stayed the same.
