They thoroughly enjoyed the hands-on activities and came away with new knowledge they can use in everyday life.

#### **Bikeability**

Year 6 took part in the Bikeability programme, where they learnt the essential skills needed to cycle safely and confidently on the road. The children practised control and awareness when riding, and listened carefully to guidance on road safety, signalling, and being considerate of other road users. They showed great perseverance and responsibility throughout the sessions.



#### **Imagination Library**

Nottingham Imagination Library is holding a 'Big Reading Challenge' from Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> September to Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> September. Supporters will read stories to as many children as possible during the week.

Nottingham Imagination Library is an amazing scheme that delivers a free book every month to local children from birth up to five years of age.

The scheme helps parents and children to enjoy exploring books together. The scheme is proven to raise children's literacy levels and, by receiving these books, our children are more likely to be ready to start school when they turn five. The charity has delivered more than half-a-million books to over 11,000 children in the city since 2009.

Year 2 were lucky enough to have a visit from Councillor Imran Jalil on Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> September as part of the 'Big Reading Challenge'. The children enjoyed listening to the story 'The Smartest Giant in Town'. We want to say a huge thank you to Councillor Imran Jalil for taking the time to read with our Year 2 class.
