Swimming



English

This term, we will continue to develop our spelling skills and use of capital letters and punctuation. We will also continue to write more and add details to our writing. Our class book this half term is 'Dinosaurs and all that rubbish' by Michael Foreman. We will be using a range of outdoor learning and drama to support our creativity and writing of a persuasive letter and poem linked to this text.

Maths

In Maths, Year 1 will be representing, comparing and ordering numbers up to 20. They will then be applying their understanding of place value to continue to learn about addition and subtraction. All children have access to Numbots to support with this.

Topic

This spring term, our enquiry based curriculum will focus on transformations. In science, we will be learning about seasonal changes and noticing change throughout the year. We will also talk about what we do to adapt to the different season, and what the plants and animals of different seasons are and what they do. We will be using investigation to aid understanding of this. In geography, children will be understanding how to care for the environment and what recycling is. We will also revisit our key individual Wangari Maathai and understand how she promoted care for the environment too.

In R.E, we will be asking ourselves the question 'how do we show care for others? Why does it matter?'
