Holocaust Memorial Day – 27th January

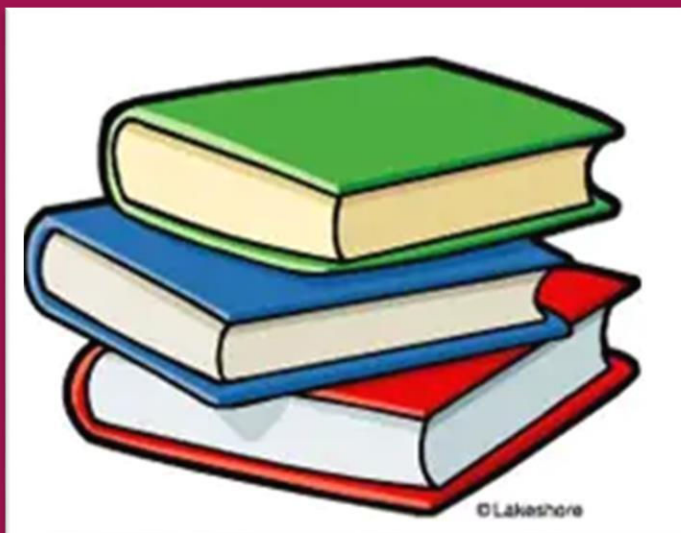
On Monday 26th January, our children took part in a thoughtful and respectful assembly to mark Holocaust Memorial Day, which takes place each year on 27th January.

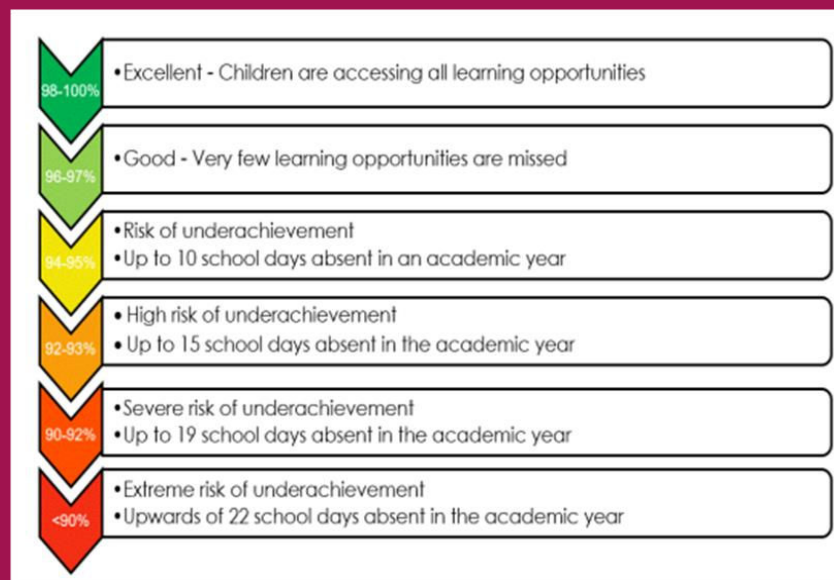
