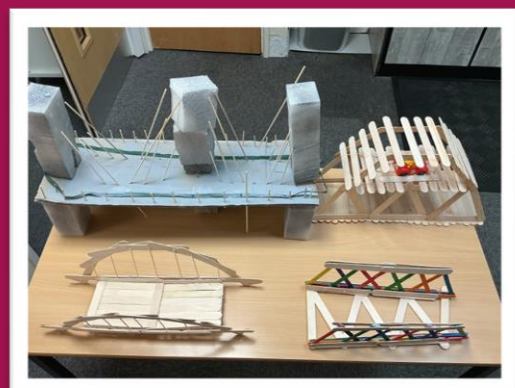
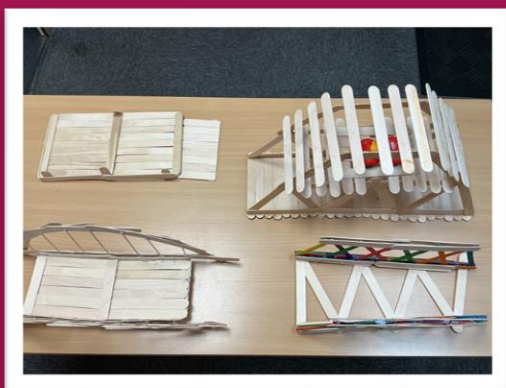

Year 3 trip to Nottingham High School

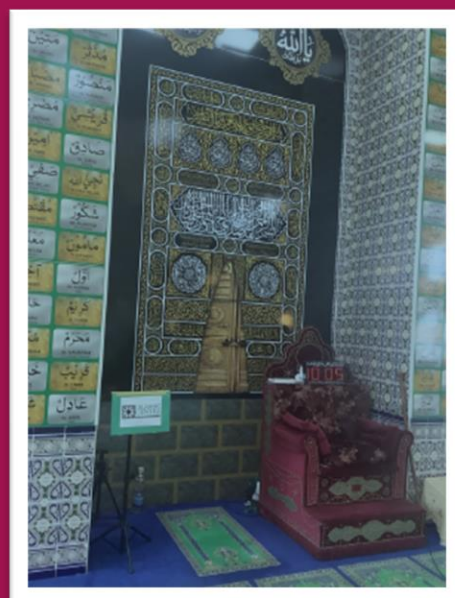

KS2 Visit to The Islamic Centre Nottingham Central Mosque

Key Stage 2 were given the opportunity to visit The Islamic Centre Nottingham Central Mosque as part of their curriculum work on 'Bridges and Structures' and our RE focus on investigating places of worship. It was an opportunity to bring learning to life and understand the religion of Islam, as well as appreciate the important features within the building, observing the architecture and comparing the similarities and differences in places of worship.

The children were greeted by an Imam, who was able to share the history of Islam and some of the practices that take place within the religion. In addition to this, the Imam explained that this particular mosque is the oldest in Nottingham. The children were given an opportunity to ask questions about the mosque and Islam. After this, the children then explored the mosque; they were able to look at the different Islamic books, the prayer mats and the Arabic writing and symbols.

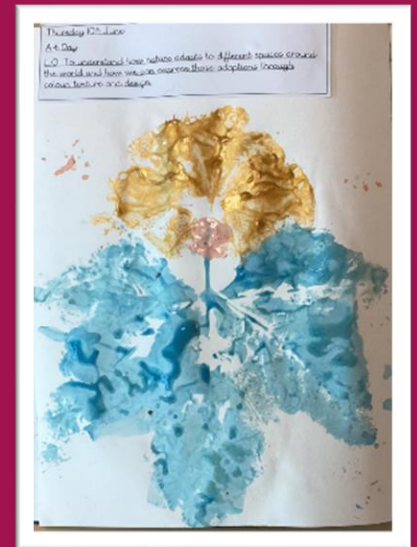


Art Day

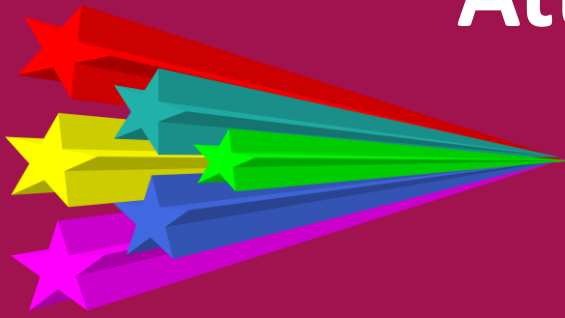
Exploring climate change through art.

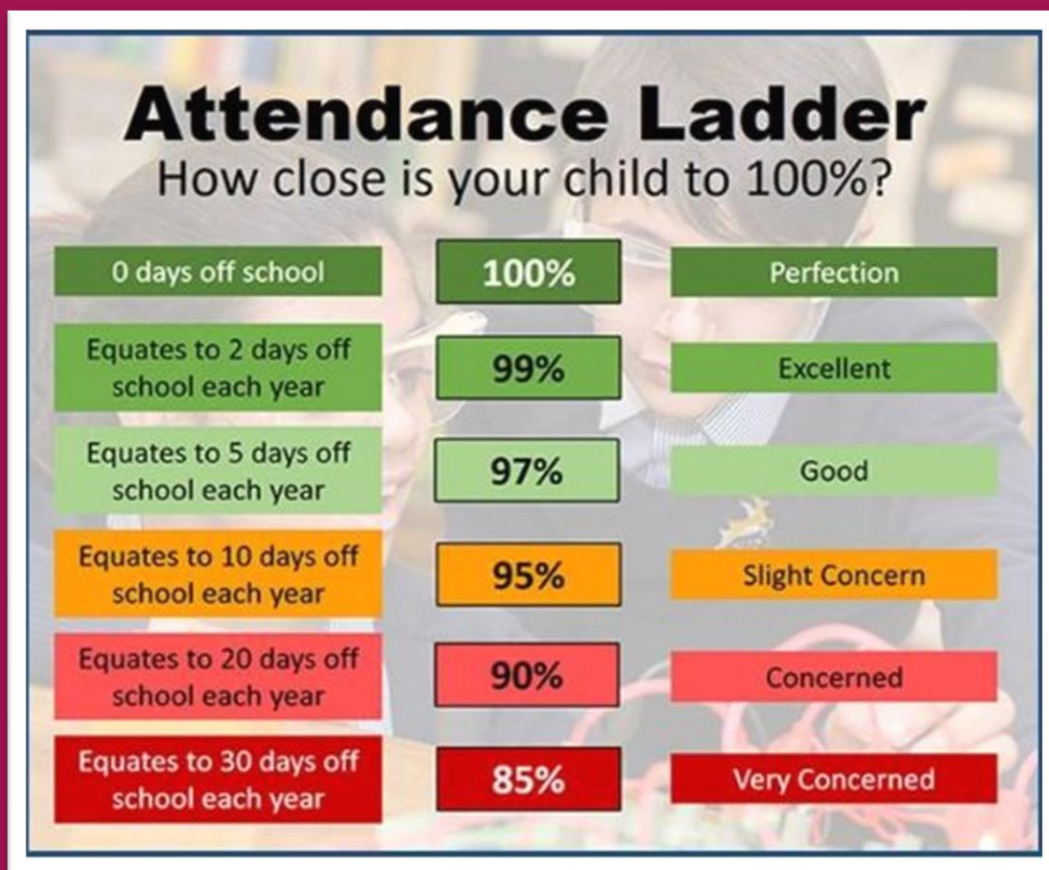
We hope this experience has broadened children's understanding of what art can be and who can be an artist, while also building their confidence to see themselves as artists.
